

JOURNEY AT TOCCOA FALLS

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. What is the total cost per person and what does it include?

Total Cost for Registration:

Early Bird Special // Before November 30th: \$220.00

After December 1: \$235.00

\$50 deposit per person due in order to confirm spots. The deposit counts towards your total balance and is non-refundable and non-transferable to another group.

Cost includes activities, lodging (4 nights), meals (11 tasty meals), camp materials, and a baller camp T-Shirt that you will wear all the days of your life.

2. When is total cost due?

The final balance is not due until **May 31, 2012** but please send \$50/person deposit so we can register your group. We must have a deposit to register your group! We do not need names, just an estimate of the total number of participants. (campers and leaders).

• *Deposit deadline is **March 15, 2012**, unless we're full by then in which case the jokes on you.*

3. Is the price the same for Youth Leaders/Adult Volunteers and Students?

Yes, the price is the same for Youth Leaders/Adult Volunteers. Youth Leaders/Adult Volunteers count towards your total number of registrants.

4. What will our rooming situation be?

You will be staying in college dormitories based on your gender. Each room is double occupancy and you will not have to sleep with strange humans from another church that is not as cool as yours. (Yay! You get to room with your peeps).

5. Will I be able to add to my group total?

As long as there is space available. If there isn't space left, we can always put you on our waiting list (see below).

6. What is the age range for camp?

Students must be between a graduated sixth grader through a graduated twelfth grader. College students are welcome to attend as Adult Leaders.

7. Can I come to camp as an individual or with a small group that is not a church?

We will welcome any group regardless of size. Unfortunately, we cannot have any teenagers roaming around un-chaperoned. There must be an Adult Group Leader.

8. How many Adult Leaders is my group required to bring?

We believe you know your students better than we do. So please use your discretion as to how many leaders you need to bring

**You must have at least one male and one female chaperone if your group contains both genders.*

9. Do you have a waiting list?

Once a camp week is full you have the option to be added to a waiting list. We do not require deposits for spots on the waiting list until those spots come available. We will contact you by phone or email should spots open up as well as after the March 15th deadline. When you are next in line you will have 24 hours to except those spots. At that point, your deposits will be due immediately in order to secure those spots.

10. Do you have any promotional materials for the Journey Camp?

You bet we do! We will provide a promotional video and some banging graphics to help you promote your camp. The 2012 Promo Video will be available as a free download by January 1, 2012 or once you register your group. You may also contact our program staff to schedule a discounted ministry event, to help promote your camp (we may be able to come to you!).

11. What do the morning and evening worship services look like?

The morning session is more casual and contains interactive worship and a short devo talk from one of our speakers. The evening service is involves extended worship with singing, media, and dynamic messages centered on biblical truth.

12. What are the afternoon activities?

During the afternoon, you and your group will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities, which includes, but is not limited to:

Athletic:

Soccer, Basketball, Ultimate Frisbee, Frisbee Golf, Volleyball, Dodge Ball, Sports Tournaments

Recreational:

Spring-fed pool for swimming, Hiking trails with waterfalls and additional swimming holes, Climbing Wall, Board Games, Team Challenge Course, Obstacle Course, Toccoa Falls (the tallest waterfall in North America is on campus!)

Artistic:

Arts/Crafts, Music Studio, Musical Lounge/Jam Sessions, Photography

Spiritual:

Prayer Experience

Off Campus (shh!)

Tallulah Falls natural sliding rock! Optional for each group based on transportation.

** They can choose whichever activity/(ies) they wish from 1-5pm. Some of these activities are open to anyone anytime. Other activities require sign-up and they will have the opportunity to do so when you arrive and throughout camp. They do not need to sign up for activities before camp. None of these activities are mandatory, but we strongly encourage you and your chaperones to make them mandatory among your group. In other words, you have the option of requiring your students to participate in some type of activity for the duration of these 4 hours. Your students will only have free time if you allow them to.*

13. What are the morning workshops?

Morning workshops are a time where we teach the scriptures in a way your students can understand more fully what it means to be a disciple of Jesus in today's culture. Each student will attend three workshops, including a guys/girls only session.

15. What is church group time? When is church group time?

Church group time is a time in which your particular group will be able to get together and recap the day. We provide no structure for this time in an effort to allow you to do as you see fit. Some groups talk about the day and what they have learned and are learning, some groups also come prepared with four devotions for the week, etc. This is your time with your group at the end of each day.

16. What is late night?

We enjoy hosting campus wide epic games that rival the competitions held by highlanders of Scotland. Capture the flag, Underground Church, and other mind-blowing activities take place during this time. Some Late night activities are chill: Live music, glass-bottled cokes, and moon pies in Grace Auditorium. Come prepared.

*** IMPORTANT FINANCIAL INFORMATION ***

- A registration deposit of \$50 per person is required for all Journey Camp participants. This deposit is due by March 15, 2012. The deposit is non-refundable. If a camper cancels, their deposit cannot be applied to a group balance, but can be transferred to another person as their deposit.
- Once registered, you can add campers to your total as long as we have space. Please call our office to verify space availability when adding campers.
- Final balances must be sent in by June 1, 2012. ***There will be a \$100 late fee added to any balances not paid by June 1, 2012.***
- Payments related to your balance are refundable ONLY if cancelled ***in writing before the balance due date of June 1, 2012.***
- If you have cancellations, please call **before** the due date to avoid paying the balance for spaces you will not be using. ALL GROUPS will be financially responsible for any cancellations after the balance due date of June 1.

Fees must be paid with a check, money order, or credit card. \$25 will be charged for a returned check. For any payments by credit card related to your final balance, please be aware of a 3% surcharge. If you have any questions, please contact us by phone at (704) 829-9512.
